

THUS, WHEN YOU GIVE TO THE NEEDY, SOUND NO TRUMPET BEFORE YOU, AS THE HYPOCRITES DO IN THE SYNAGOGUES AND IN THE STREETS, THAT THEY MAY BE PRAISED BY OTHERS. TRULY, I SAY TO YOU, THEY HAVE RECEIVED THEIR REWARD. BUT WHEN YOU GIVE TO THE NEEDY, DO NOT LET YOUR LEFT HAND KNOW WHAT YOUR RIGHT HAND IS DOING, SO THAT YOUR GIVING MAY BE IN SECRET. AND YOUR FATHER WHO SEES IN SECRET WILL REWARD YOU.*

(MATTHEW 6:1-4)

The Pharisees wanted to be seen. They spent their time making a big show of what they did and how much they gave to the poor. They thought what they did made them perfect and proved how righteous they were. But really they were thinking more about themselves than about God. They wanted to be noticed and praised.

Jesus wants us to understand that if we do what we do because we love God, then who sees us doing it shouldn't matter. When we make doing things for God more important than being seen by others, we are becoming more like lesus.

Wanting to be seen wasn't the Pharisees' only problem. They were trying to be perfect on their own. But because of sin, they could never be perfect.

What are ways people still try to be perfect?

Some people try to be seen serving as much as they can in their church or community. Other people read their Bible a lot and make sure friends and family know. Maybe you know people who brag about how much they help the poor or needy.

These things aren't bad; in fact, they are great things that we should all do! But when we are doing things to make ourselves look perfect and because of the praise we get, we are missing the mark.

What do you do to be noticed by others? Do you do the things you do to look perfect or because you love God and want to be like Him?



OT-NT CONNECTION

The Pentateuch is the first five books of the Bible. These books — Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy contain the Law that God gave to the Israelites. The Law gave us the standard of holiness that God required of His people. God demanded perfection from them but also provided a way to restore His relationship with them through sacrifices and offerings when that standard was not met.

DOESN'T FOLLOWING GOD'S LAWS IN THE BIBLE MAKE ME PERFECT?

If you never sinned you would be perfect; but since everyone sins, no one can keep God's law perfectly. A better question is, "Is your goal to do all the right things or to become more like Jesus?" We can never be perfect on our own. Following God's law is important; but spending time with God, learning about Him and living how He wants us to live helps us to become more like Jesus.

HOW DO I NOT WANT TO BE PERFECT LIKE EVERYONE ON SOCIAL MEDIA?

It is easy to believe that what you see on social media is something you need to live up to. The truth is, what you see isn't reality. The people who look perfect are just as flawed as you. If you are feeling pressured to be perfect, take a break! Spend time with friends, read your Bible or listen to worship music. Remember who God says you are and who He wants you to be; that is the real reality!

JOURNAL

Jesus warns us to not be hypocrites. Read Matthew 23:27-28. How have you tried to look perfect and righteous in front of others? Write a prayer asking God to help you not be fake in what you do and say.

FIND

This week's verse is in the book of Matthew. Help your child find the book of Matthew. Is this book in the Old or New Testament? How many chapters are there?

ONE DROP

Fill a clear jar or glass with water. Let your child put a drop of food coloring into the jar. What happens to the water? One drop colors the water forever. The water will never be perfectly clear on its own. When we sin, even once, we are changed by that sin forever. We can never be perfectly cleansed from our sin on our own. But when we trust Jesus as our Savior, we are forgiven and Jesus makes us clean again.

PAPER AIRPLANES

Make paper airplanes and have a contest to see which airplane flies the farthest and the best. Do the airplanes fly perfectly every time? Can the airplane fix itself when it gets crumpled? Just like paper airplanes can't make themselves perfect again after being damaged, we can't make ourselves perfect after we are damaged by sin.
