How many do you think you could hold at one time? What if I asked you to get me a glass of water at the same time? Do you think you could do it without dropping anything or spilling the water?

With your arms so full it would be almost impossible to do anything at all for someone else. In the same way, if our hands and hearts are holding tight to the treasure and money we have, how can we help anyone else?

Today we will read from the book of 1 Timothy, chapter six. Paul wrote two letters to a man named Timothy. Timothy was younger than Paul, and Paul wanted to help Timothy grow to be more like Jesus.













Let's read what Paul said about the things we treasure. Can you help me find 1 Timothy 6, verses 17-19? The book of 1 Timothy is in the New Testament.

AS FOR THE RICH IN THIS PRESENT AGE. CHARGE THEM NOT TO BE HAUGHTY. NOR TO SET THEIR HOPES ON THE UNCERTAINTY OF RICHES, BUT ON GOD, WHO RICHLY PROVIDES US WITH EVERYTHING TO ENJOY. THEY ARE TO DO GOOD, TO BE RICH IN GOOD WORKS, TO BE GENEROUS AND READY TO SHARE. THUS STORING UP TREASURE FOR THEMSELVES AS A GOOD FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE, SO THAT THEY MAY TAKE HOLD OF THAT WHICH IS TRULY LIFE.

aren't evil. But when those things become more important to us than anything else, they become an idol in our lives. Instead of trusting in what we have, we should trust God who gives us everything in the first place.

By themselves, money and treasure

God wants us to be rich in the things that matter. Paul said we should be rich in good works, do good, and be generous and ready to share. We should use what we have to help others. What we do with what we have is much more important than what we have in the first place!



1 TIMOTHY 6:17-19

How can you share what you have and be generous with your friends and family? Maybe you have extra clothes you never wear or that don't fit you anymore. Perhaps you have toys you don't play with or books you don't read. Is there someone who could use them?

Do you have time you could spend helping someone? Does someone around you need a meal? Could you make someone who is lonely a nice card or piece of artwork?

There is always someone in need and something that needs to be done. You don't have to do it all. What you do doesn't need to be fancy or complicated. But when you use what God gave you to help others, then your treasure is in heaven. Then you are rich in the things that matter.

FIND IT IN THE BIBLE: TIMOTH

This week's story comes from the book of 1 Timothy. 1 Timothy is an epistle, or letter. The missionary Paul wrote this letter, and it is one of three letters called a Pastoral Epistle.

He writes to his friend Timothy about false teachers, instructions for the Church and how to live out the Christian faith.

OT-NT CONNECTION

God has always cared about what we do with what we have. The books of Psalms and Proverbs teach us how God views generosity.

- Psalm 37:21: The righteous give generously.
- Psalm 112:5: Good will come to the generous.
- **Proverbs 11:25**: A generous man will prosper.
- Proverbs 22:9: A generous man will be blessed.

God may call some people to give away all they have, but that is not true for everybody. There are very wealthy people who love God deeply. Two questions to ask yourself are:

"Do I act like my stuff is more important than God? How does God want me to be generous with what I have?"

I DON'T HAVE MONEY TO GIVE AWAY; HOW **CAN I BE GENEROUS?**

God cares more about our heart than about the quantity of money we give away. We can always be generous with our time, gifts and talents. He wants us to have a heart ready to share no matter how much money we have.

JOURNAL

1 Timothy 6:17-19 says that we are to: Do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share. What is one practical way you can live those things out this week? Write a short prayer asking God to help you be generous in everything you do.

READ



Read Acts 2:40-47. The believers in the early church give us an example of how we should live with one another. Notice the ways they were generous with each other. What is one way you can follow their example and be generous with your friends and family?

SHARE



Tell your child about a time when you were blessed by someone who was generous with you.



Gather as many stuffed animals and pillows as you can find. Take turns seeing how many each person can hold at the same time. Try doing things with your arms full? Can you open doors, tie your shoe or get a snack? Point out that when your arms are full, all you can do is focus on what you are holding. What treasure does each person need to let go of to be available to help friends and family?

LET'S MAKE A PLAN

As a family, make a list of one thing per month that your family can do to be generous and share with others. Get creative! Ideas could include baking cookies or a meal for someone, filling a backpack with toiletries for a homeless person, or taking time to clean an elderly neighbor's yard or house.


