Was it easy? Did it turn out like the picture on the box?

Think about how silly it would be to open up a huge, expensive, brand-new box of building bricks and then toss the instruction book in the trash! What if you kept the directions, but put them on a bookshelf and didn't look at them? Would that help you build the set? Without looking at the instructions, I think it'd be very difficult to use all the pieces correctly and build the set, don't you?

Unfortunately, this is how many people choose to live their lives.

The Bible is God's Word — an instruction book that helps us build our lives according to His plan. Some people try to build their lives without His help and ignore the truth of His words. But if we really want to be wise, we must read the Bible and obey it.















God's Word is precious, sweeter than honey and more costly than gold. The psalmist didn't just read and obey God's Word, he LOVED God's Word. Listen to what he says in Psalm 19:7-9.

THE LAW OF THE LORD IS PERFECT, REVIVING THE SOUL; THE TESTIMONY OF THE LORD IS SURE, MAKING WISE THE SIMPLE; THE PRECEPTS OF THE LORD ARE RIGHT, REJOIGING THE HEART; THE COMMANDMENT OF THE LORD IS PURE, ENLIGHTENING THE EYES: THE FEAR OF THE LORD IS CLEAN, ENDURING FOREVER; THE RULES OF THE LORD ARE TRUE, AND RIGHTEOUS ALTOGETHER.



(PSALM 19:7-9)

FIND IT IN THE BIBLE:

The book of Psalms was written during the time period of the Old Testament. Many, like the one we are studying this week, were written by King David.

When we don't have words to pray or praise God with, the Psalms are a great place to find ideas. We can use the words of the psalmist to connect to God through worship and prayer.

READ



John 1:1-5 calls Jesus the WORD of God, present from the very beginning and Creator of all things. When Jesus came to Earth in the form of a man, He came to shine a light in our darkness, to teach us and to rescue us from sin.

Read the words of Jesus in Matthew 7:24-27.

- What makes us wise?
- What are the benefits of listening to Jesus' words?
- How should we build our lives?

OT-NT CONNECTION

God's Word is Truth (John 17:17). It is breathed out by God. powerful, alive and useful for many things (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

Read 1 Peter 1:22-25, 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and Hebrews 4:12.

- What is God's Word useful for?
- What does it accomplish in us?

HOW DO WE KNOW THE BIBLE IS ACTUALLY GOD'S WORD?

God told us the Bible is His Word.

The Bible was written by 40 different authors who were inspired by God to write His Words down over a period of 1,500 years. For many years, people carefully preserved God's Word by hand. By the 1400s, the printing press was invented, which made copying the Bible much simpler.

In 1946, the Dead Sea Scrolls (ancient copies of many of the books of the Old Testament) were discovered in a cave in Qumran. Inside, archaeologists found hundreds of scrolls that contained very few changes from the Word of God we have today.

WERE GOD'S WORDS WRITTEN IN ENGLISH?

The Bible was originally written in Hebrew and Greek. As Christianity spread through the early church to people who spoke different languages, the need to translate the Scriptures grew. Around A.D. 400, the Bible was translated into Latin. which was the official language of the Roman Empire. It wasn't until 1384 that John Wycliffe completed the first English translation of the

According to the Wycliffe Global Alliance, there are now 724 language translations of the complete Bible and 1,617 of the New Testament. We can praise God that up to 97% of people on the earth can read and understand some part of God's Word in their language.

Share your art with each other and explain why the verse you picked is precious to you.
